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INTRODUCTION

The ICAI Thrissur Branch (SIRC) is committed to promoting professional excellence, ethical values, and continuous learning within the Chartered Accountancy profession. This Annual Report for April 2025 to March 2026 presents the Branch's key initiatives, achievements and financial performance during the year, reflecting the collective efforts of the Managing Committee, members, students, faculty, and staff.

A key focus this year was further strengthening students' academic foundation through structured coaching for CA Foundation, Intermediate, and Final levels, alongside ICITSS/AICITSS programmes—Orientation, ITT, Advanced ITT, and MCS—that build the technical and professional skills essential to a CA career. Career awareness programmes across educational institutions further encouraged prospective students to pursue the profession.

The Branch also conducted an extensive range of CPE programmes, certification courses, seminars, and conferences on emerging developments in taxation, auditing, financial reporting, technology, artificial intelligence, and corporate law, complemented by student-centric, leadership, financial literacy, and community service initiatives.

Governance remained a priority, with statutory meetings and administration conducted in full compliance with ICAI and SIRC guidelines. The Branch's achievements were recognized at the **57th Regional Conference of SIRC**, where it received the **Best Branch Award (Medium Category)** and the **Best SICASA Award (Large Category)**—a testament to its commitment to excellence.

This report documents the Branch's milestones and reaffirms its continued dedication to professional excellence, member and student development, and meaningful service to the profession and society.

FINANCIAL PERFORMAMCE SUMMARY

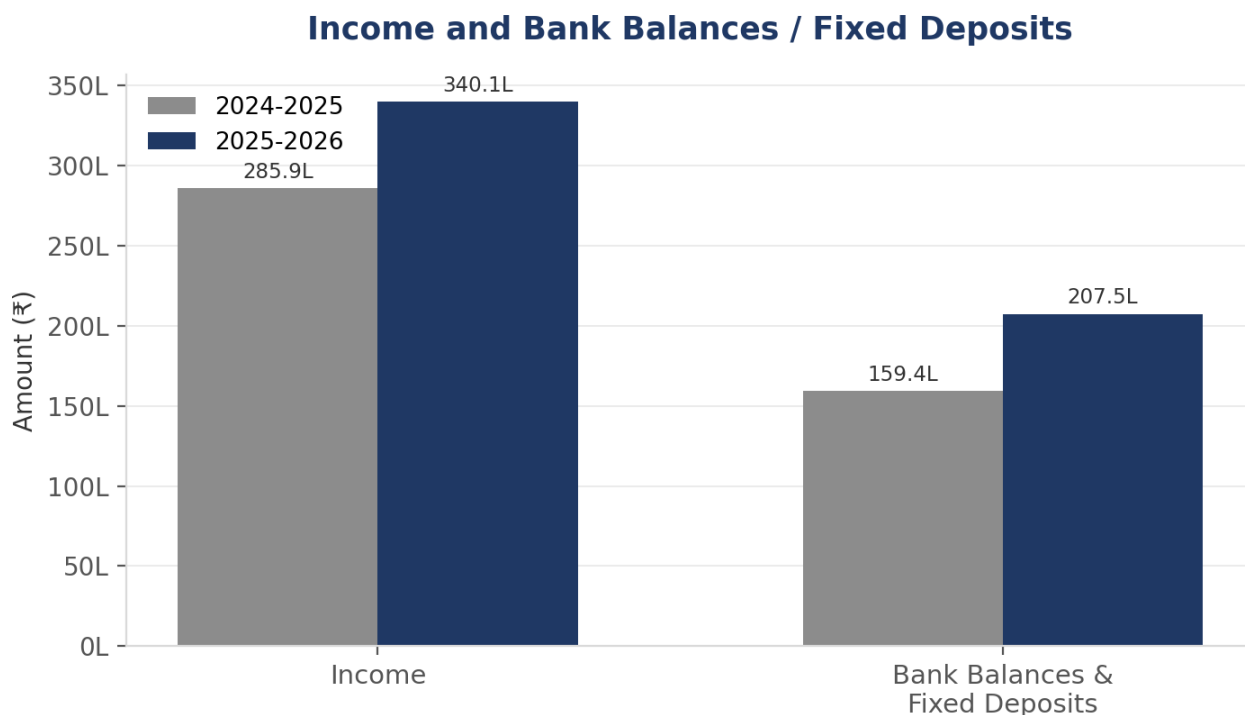
The financial performance of the Branch during 2025-2026 reflects a marked improvement over the previous year, with a strong turnaround in operating results, healthy growth in income, and a robust build-up of reserves. The key financial indicators for the year, along with comparative figures for 2024-2025, are summarized below.

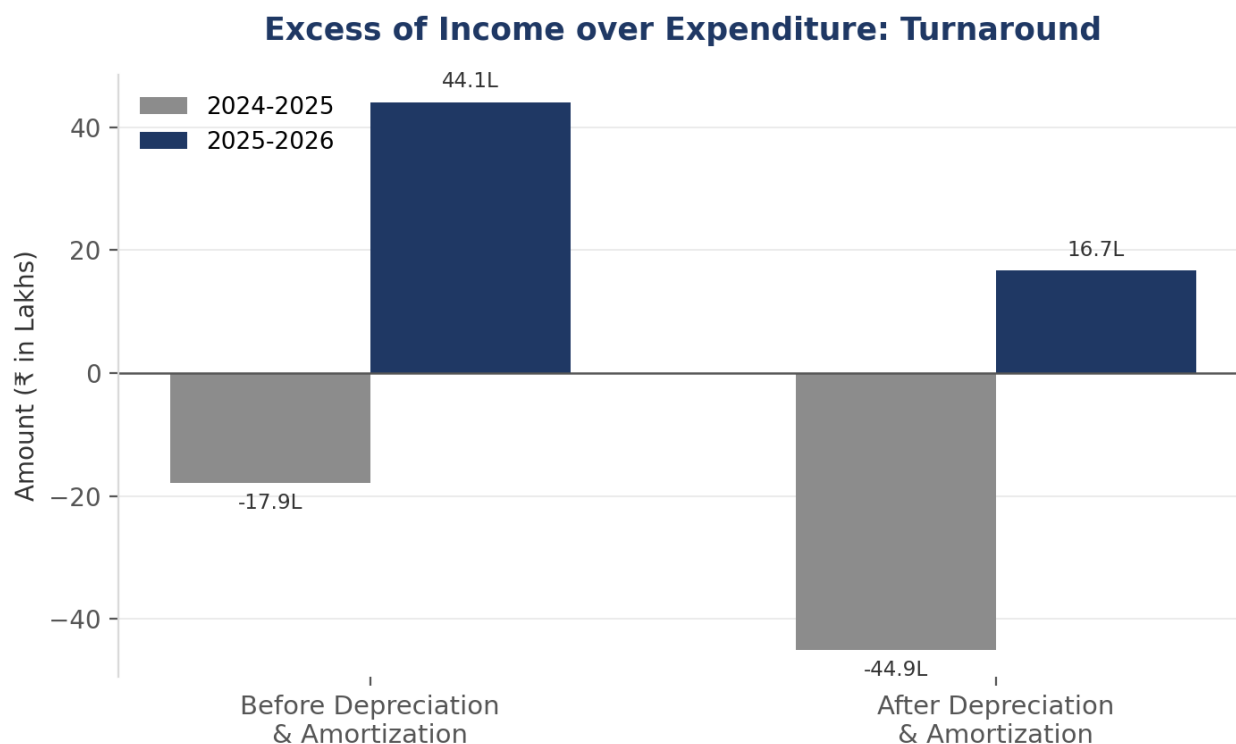
Income and Reserve Position

Total income rose to ₹3,40,09,153 in 2025-2026 from ₹2,85,88,834 in 2024-2025, an increase of ₹54,20,319. Bank balances and fixed deposits grew correspondingly to ₹2,07,53,152, up ₹48,11,243 over the previous year, reflecting improved liquidity and prudent financial management.



Turnaround in Excess of Income over Expenditure

The Branch recorded a significant turnaround in its operating surplus. The excess of income over expenditure before depreciation and amortization improved from a deficit of ₹17,87,758 in 2024-2025 to a surplus of ₹44,06,905 in 2025-2026, an improvement of ₹61,94,663. Similarly, the excess of income over expenditure after depreciation and amortization moved from a deficit of ₹44,94,021 to a surplus of ₹16,71,690, an improvement of ₹61,65,711.



Key Observations

- The Branch has moved from a deficit to a healthy surplus position on both a pre- and post-depreciation basis, indicating a sound recovery in operational efficiency.
- Income growth of ₹54.20 lakhs (18.96%) was achieved through expanded programme offerings and improved cost management.
- Bank balances and fixed deposits increased by ₹48.11 lakhs (30.18%), strengthening the Branch's financial reserves and its ability to support future initiatives.
- The improvement of ₹61.95 lakhs in operating surplus before depreciation reflects the combined impact of higher income and disciplined expenditure control.
